
Corrections:

Your Trillium committee is very excited about the plans that we have for you for this year's Trillium Conference. As new GR's and DR's we need you to continue with the task of promoting Trillium in your home groups and districts. With your excitement and enthusiasm Trillium will be able to reach out to many of our members and support them in their recovery journeys through enhancing the sense of fellowship and recovery through our shared experiences, strength and hope.

We are very excited about our main speakers: - Friday Night Opening speaker, Claire R., Virginia Beach, Virginia – Saturday Night main speaker, Gen B., Port Hawkesbury, NS – Sunday Morning Closing speaker, Pamela W., Niagara Falls, ON

At this point we have 80 “some” early registrations. WOW! REMEMBER for those who register prior to Trillium there will be 2 more draws for a free registration (March 1 and April 5) and there will also be a draw for 1 night's free accommodation on May 3.

Our journals are this year's Trillium memento. Journals will continue to be made available between now and Trillium by contacting me (mjhurley1@rogers.com). They are priced a \$3 for one or 2 for \$5.

What can you do for Trillium?

- Use the flyer that is attached to Open Lines, photocopy it and personally hand it to your group members.
- Talk about how you can plan to get to Trillium – what would it take? Car pooling, saving your money now....
- Register early even if you have missed the early registration of February 6. It really helps with our cash flow!
- SAM's going to Trillium – please register early and call 705 429-1740 so that our Alateen co-ordinators could enlist your help with some part of the conference.
- Alateens attending Trillium will need to bring the completed permission and health forms. GR'S and DR's will need to ensure that they are aware of this and that the forms can be found on the Ontario south web site.
- Book directly with the hotel (see the flyer) for your hotel room by February 6, 2009 to get the early rate. Failing meeting this date, register with the hotel as soon as you know that you will be attending. Knowing the room bookings in advance helps us again with our financial commitments for this conference.
- Plan how your group and district will fundraise to financially support Trillium. A few ideas: keep a loose change tin on your table marked Trillium contributions and pass it around at the end of your meeting. Make Trillium a budget item as part of your District's budget and contribute from district revenues. Host a Games Night, a Potluck Dinner, a Spaghetti Dinner or anything else that you might devise and send the proceeds to Trillium

- A little forward thinking.... As you plan to come think about what your favourite sandwich tray or veggie tray or fruit tray or whatever goodie you can bring to contribute to the Hospitality Room.
