This month's question is: ' How is the World Service Office linked to the national service offices located in other countries? What function does the WSO perform? How do the other countries contribute to WSO?'

Greetings from the World Service Office!

Thank you for your recent e-mail.

The World Service Office, originally called the Clearinghouse in 1951, is the oldest service structure for Al-Anon Family Groups. Therefore, within that role, the World Service Office provides services based on the collected experience, strength, and hope of groups around the world using the Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of Service as the foundation of that experience.

For countries with a national service structure, the World Service Office is the service link/resource for volunteers and staff involved in service. When there is no national service structure in a country, the World Service Office is the link for potential members, members, and groups. Once an Al-Anon national service structure forms in a country, that service structure eventually takes over the day to day responsibilities, from the World Service Office, of servicing the groups.

Since the primary support for a service structure is from the groups within the country, countries with a national service structure (like the groups, areas and provinces within the US and Canada) usually contribute to the World Service Office after all of their local expenses are met.

We appreciate the opportunity given to respond.

On behalf of the World Service Office, please pass along our warmest wishes to all.

Area Alateen Process Person Report

Hello. I am Nick M, a grateful member of Al-Anon and the Unity Al-Anon Family Group in Welland and I am the Area 86 Area Alateen Process Person, AAPP for short.

The deadline has passed for all Ontario South SAM's to send their annual re-certifications in for 2009. To-date 87 of last year's 134 SAM's have re-certified and I know of several that are in transit. We have been privileged to certify 14 new SAM's in the first quarter of this year as well. So in total Ontario South has 104 active certified SAM's.

The District Reps will be sent the list of active SAM's in their respective Districts by the end of April. Any SAM's who have not re-certified, and are not on the list, will be classed as Inactive and will need to re-certify with WSO before renewing activity in Alateen. Instructions for this process are contained in the Ontario South Guidelines, Section 11B.

Could the SAM's who know that they will not be continuing in Alateen service this year please confirm this with me through a quick note or call. My address, telephone number, and email address are on the back page of this issue of OpenLines.

Questions have arisen lately regarding the responsibility of SAM's in reporting abuse, or suspected abuse, that Alateens may mention in Alateen or Al-Anon meetings. The Children's Aid Societies in Ontario have been made the legal contacts in these issues, and have very good literature describing the Ontario Child and Family Services Act (CFSA) and how it pertains to anyone in the province. The SAM's in Districts 12 and 13 have been given this information to help them in this regard. As well, the WSO Guideline G-34, Alateen Safety Guidelines, has a section on this topic.

There are Alateen workshops scheduled for the April/May timeframe in Niagara Falls and Wasaga Beach and I hope to join them and benefit from all of the Alateen and SAM friendship and camaraderie.

Archives Coordinator Report

It has also been great fun going to different groups, anniversaries and Al-Anon Days to talk about Archives and do workshops. I was invited to Main Street Fellowship on March 12 to talk about Archives and the history of their group just prior to their anniversary. On March 26, District 21 invited me to their district meeting to talk about our Archives as well as group and oral histories.

April 4th I attended the 4th Annual Archives Workshop put on by AA District 83 with the theme One Yesterday At a Time. Carolyn Bart-Riedstra, Archives Association of Ontario advisor presented An Introduction to Arrangement and Description in Archives. It was more learning about Archival procedures of cataloguing, storage and preservation. Other topics were setting up a display, Group Histories, Oral Histories and a fantastic tour of the City of Toronto Archives.

April 18th I led an Archives presentation/workshop at Districts 14 and 15 Al-Anon Day in Hamilton. May 2nd I am at District 2 Al-Anon Day in Dundalk for an Archives presentation and workshop. It is a great way to carry the message about Archives to members in our Area

If you would like me to come to your group/district, anniversary, Al-Anon event please let me know. It is another great way to carry the message and keep our history alive.

Group in Ontario South are continuing their great work in completing Group Histories and Oral Histories. If your group is new, now is the time to do the history while all the information is still fresh. Take pictures of your meeting place, the meeting space, your literature display and any other things that are unique to your group. Remember it is the stories about your group that matter.

GROUP HISTORIES: Here are some questions to think about? When did we start? Why this place? Who was involved? How is it that we are still here? How are we carrying the message? Did a group branch off? Do we do traditions? Did we do traditions? There are different ways to capture your group history: group history checklist, photos, meeting logs, all minutes. A picture of a meeting place can tell a whole story. Oral histories are also a part of your group history. It is not just yes or no answers to the questions but the stories around those answers that tell the history of the group. Keep a copy of your group history in the front of the meeting binder. It is a reminder that carrying the message is why we are still here and continue to come each week. Keep Coming Back

ORAL HISTORIES:

Why Oral Histories? We are a nation of story tellers. The book Lois Remembers is a story. When I read this I can "hear" Lois and the other people telling the story.

The facts These are very important but the stories capture the essence of the language that comes from the heart. It is the voices, the words, and the person. Who were your peers when you came in the Al-Anon? is just one question.

The Story Teller These are the founders of your home group, your sponsor, the Area Delegate, A longtimer.

Are you the right person? Ask yourself if you are the right person to interview a particular member.

Be clear about the purpose. What did Al-Anon look like when you began? Get the story.

An Appropriate time. Pay attention to the person you are interviewing. About 45 minutes is long enough unless they want to continue.

Location It could be at the person's house, at our house, after tea, in the car. Be aware of anonymity.

Gather information Do your homework. Know what you are not being told. Who was around at the same time as the person you are interviewing? Consult the area or district archivist to find information. Chat with group members, long timers. The more you know the better equipped you are.

The Interview: Send out or give the person questions in advance. Be realistic. Don't push them for information. Let them tell their story. If they get off track guide them back to the questions.

Be sensitive

Identify yourself and the interviewee along with the date and the place of the interview.

Focus It is on the person's direct experience. Focus on Recovery, Unity, Service

Release forms: There are legal issues. The release can be done on paper or recorded on tape and then transferred to a form. Ask the question: Who would you like to see this?

Check the Oral Histories Kit for copies of a release form. See information under Resources

Equipment Electronic Devices-make sure you are able to play back what you have recorded. Check and test your equipment. Bring extra batteries.

Saving copies Take care in saving copies. Make back-up copies at least twice and do it right away. This avoids accidentally erasing the original before you have copied it. Copies are then made from the copy and not the original. The original becomes the Archival copy.

Transfer to other mediums—e.g. CD to DVD; tape to CD or DVD Ask-Do I have the equipment to play back what I have? Then transfer to paper as it is the most stable medium.

Storage Identify, label and catalogue very carefully. Store in a cool dry location and off the floor.

Replaying and copying Always replay from the copy. Make copies from the copy.

Access Who has access to the oral history/interview? This is determined by the stipulation in the release forms.

RESOURCES:

Group History Check list; Longtimer Questionnaire -- from Al-Anon WSO website

Oral Histories Kit; Archives Workbook --available to download. Type in: Archivist Area 83. This material is public domain. Please adapt to your own use. It is a wonderful example of how we cooperate with AA.

DID YOU KNOW: If you have old negatives of Al-Anon events and/or members you can halt them from degrading by putting them in the freezer?

Has everyone in your group read LOIS REMEMBERS? If members are not able to do this individually why not have a short time before or after a meeting to read a section. Or it could be a way of continuing the fellowship outside the regular meeting by getting together to read a section. If we continue to order this book from the LDC the demand will keep the book in print. FIRST STEPS If you have a copy of First Steps it is an Archival book of historical value. This book is no longer in print.

ARCHIVAL What makes something archival? It is reviewed and deemed of historical value to be maintained forever. Ontario South has the beginnings of Al-Anon and wonderful Archival material.

COPIES OF GROUP HISTORIES: If your group/district would like a copy of your group history/histories please let me know by May 1st or as soon as possible. I will make copies and bring them to AWSC. This will save postage.

AL-ANON MEMORIAL BOOK This is another group project that reminds us of the stories that were told by members who are no longer with us. I will bring copies of a template for this project. Or if you have one already completed please bring it to AWSC to put in the binder.

If you need help with any of the above please contact me. I am happy to help.

Literature Coordinator Report

G'Day Mates!

The world-wide fellowship of our program is demonstrated for me in real terms when I am in Australia – experience, strength and hope shared by members is the same whether I am at my home meeting in Ottawa or in a meeting at the Australian National Convention in Surfers Paradise. While I was away, there was a Conference Call organized by WSO for all Area Literature Coordinators. Many thanks to Lin McS (GR for 12 Step Discovery AFG in Ottawa) for sitting in for me and taking notes. Among the information provided during the call was the following about how CAL (Conference Approved Literature) is revised. "Just as AI Anon literature is written by AI Anon members, suggestions for changes come from our members too. There have been many revisions to our literature in the last five or six years. This was the result of a literature inventory that the WSO conducted beginning in the late 1990s of all CAL. It included input from all 67 Areas of the World Service Conference structure. In examining this input, the members of the Literature Committee made recommendations regarding which pieces should remain the same, which should be revised (and to what degree), and which should no longer be printed. Major changes that rewrite material for a change in focus, audience, or intent from the original motion require a motion from the World Service Conference. Revisions to update, clarify, or improve the flow without changing the intent, audience, or focus do not require a Conference motion, but still follow the involved process which includes scrupulous review by the Literature Committee; Policy reviewers, and staff. Housekeeping changes (updating addresses and phone numbers, correcting grammar and punctuation errors, etc.) are handled by staff."

Keep your eyes open for more Literature projects coming from WSO – I'll be sending out information during May to the DRs who will then forward it to GRs who will bring it to your meeting.

I'm looking forward AWSC May 22 to 24 where I'll get to meet all the DRs. We're going to have a great time while doing AI-Anon business!

Website Coordinator Report


Bonjour,
