



PUBLIC OUTREACH PROJECT- OPEN HOUSE IN LIBRARIES

Public Outreach, AI- Anon/ Alateen's project for 2013- 2014, was to have an Open House in as many Libraries as possible in Districts 12 & 13. Our Display Boards and our Literature would be available for anyone seeking information on our programs.

Members of the P. O. Committee and some of the Group Reps contacted the Library in their own cities.

Literature Kits for Professionals, along with 2 Posters were made up for the Librarians, to prepare them for our visit. All of the Librarians were very eager to help us & were pleased that we were doing this. October was Library month, so it was very timely.

Some branches did not have a space for our display, or it was not a good time for them, but, we still made a kit available to them. From this, came an excellent idea; we could make up binders with plastic sheets & insert suitable AI –Anon/ Alateen Literature in them. These binders would be available for anyone to read them, right there in the Library. Public Outreach is thinking of doing the same for the libraries that we visited.

Appointments were made for Saturday mornings, for 2 to 3 hrs. for September, 2013, until January, 2014. Some Librarians posted announcements in their Newsletters & put up the Posters, or made their own displays. In Dunnville, a reporter from the Sagem/ Glanbrook Gazette came to do an interview. An excellent article appeared on the Monday in that paper. It could also be found on-line.

The colourful Display Boards & all the Literature on the tables were noticed by the public, although people seemed hesitant to speak with our volunteers or take some pamphlets. All our volunteers were very much aware of the anonymity and the sensitivity of their presence there. (Attraction rather than Promotion)

As a "Thank You" to the libraries, a book was donated to each of them. Some Libraries had one book; others, had a few; some, none. So, all the books were gratefully received.

Thanks go out to LDC. & District 13 for the donation of these books.

A HUGE " THANK YOU" goes out to all the volunteers, who gave up their Sat. morning to do this 12th step work & help Public Outreach to continue to do theirs.

PUBLIC OUTREACH COORDINATOR

As the new Area Public Outreach Coordinator, I wanted to comment on a response to an "Ask-it Basket" questions that was published in the last *Open Lines* (December, 2013) concerning dual members and service in Al-Anon Information Services ("AIS", or public outreach committees). The response (reproduced below) seemed to say dual members cannot be a member of an AIS. I Chair the Ottawa AIS, and we have several dual members on our committee and serving on our Telephone Answering Service. It was my understanding for a number of years has been that this was ok, as long as no dual member held a position with a vote at Group, District, Area or level beyond. In our District, typically the Alternate Group Representative (AGR) sits on AIS. A dual member cannot be AGR, but could represent the group at the AIS table without being the AGR. So, I sought out some experience, strength and hope to confirm or correct my understanding. I share with you my results, which confirm my understanding that dual members can serve on AIS and in Public Outreach.

Open Lines, December 2013: "Q - with regard to Dual Members, Pg 78 of the Service Manual states that a dual member can't hold a position outside of a group. GR, AGR and DR are understood, but what about AIS (Al-Anon Information Service) rep or Public Outreach rep?"

A - AIS and PO representatives are included in this list as their positions could mean that they could potentially attend AWSC (Area World Service Conference). 2010 - 2013 Service Manual pages 78 & 79."

pp. 82-83 2014 Service Manual

"Dual Membership in Al-Anon/Alateen and A.A. Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also members of A.A. are eligible to hold office within their Al-Anon or Alateen groups. Active members of Al-Anon who are also A.A.s may serve as the Sponsor of Alateen groups by virtue of their Al-Anon membership. These are vital group services, and at all times emphasis should be placed on the Al-Anon interpretation of the program.

Because of the unique nature of both programs, Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also A.A. members do not hold office beyond the group level, as these positions could lead to membership in the World Service Conference (WSC). The need to focus on the Al-Anon program and the possibility of a conflict of interest at Assembly and world service levels led the WSC to its decision not to seat Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also members of A.A. For these reasons A.A. members do not serve as Group Representatives (GRs), District Representatives (DRs), Area Coordinators, Newsletter Editors, Delegates and/or any of their alternates, nor do they sit on the WSO selected committees, whose Chairpersons can be Conference members."

However, the 2011 WSC Summary page 50 clarifies:

"There has been a lot of misunderstanding and confusion regarding the policy. There are dual members who have never heard of the policy. There are also members who believe that dual members cannot hold any service positions in Al-Anon.

The Thought Force concentrated on ways that dual members can serve Al-Anon. Dual members can:

- Serve on event committees in the Area, district, group, and AIS based on Area/local policies.
- Assist in Public Outreach service at the Area, district, group, and AIS.
- Support fellowship communications via service arm Web sites and newsletters.
- Attend to the technology needs of the Area, district, group, and AIS.
- Become certified as an Al-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS).
- Submit sharings for WSO publications.
- Support strategic planning in the Area, district, group, and AIS by serving on Thought Forces/Task Forces.
- Serve as liaison to the local A.A. fellowship. "

AIS is mentioned several times as a way dual members can serve.

This exercise did lead me to reflect that the Ask-it Basket is an important exercise and care should be taken with answering and publishing answers. Member do read *Open Lines*. It might also be useful to have an "annotated" service manual that would reference important documents, such as the WSC summary quoted above, which explain and clarify a particular policy.

Many thanks to Carl F., our District Rep for his good memory and filing system for retrieving the 2011 World Service Conference summary quoted above, Michele D. Area Chairperson for looking into things as well, and especially to all the dual members in our District and elsewhere who serve and spread the Al-Anon message.


