This is my first submission to Open Lines. Thank you to Jane for asking me to consider standing for Alateen Co-ordinator. My love and enthusiasm for Alateen made my decision quite easy. I have never considered service beyond the district level, because I guess I am comfortable there.

My sponsor was a very active Alateen sponsor in the Ottawa area when I first came to Al-Anon. I always heard about Alateen and was constantly reminded that to sponsor an Alateen group will have rich rewards for ALL. I had worked with Alateen on different committees such as Public Outreach, Trillium, even billeted 2 young teens from Scarborough while they attended the Alateen Unity Conference hosted in Ottawa one year. (You could do that back then!) It took me 15 years to make a decision regarding Alateen sponsorship. I moved to Brampton in 1991 and by 1998 finally asked the question, "Why is there NO Alateen group in our District?" Our District was strong, lots of Al-Anon meetings but no Alateen. That is how Alateen gets its start! Al-Anon is such a HUGE part of helping these Alateens to have a meeting, a place to be together.

I believe that more work needs to be done, in educating, informing the Al-Anon members/groups on how they can support Alateen, even if they don't have an Alateen group. How about displaying the table card "Has Al-Anon helped you?" (Available from your literature office) What about having a supply of Alateen literature on your table, for the parents, relatives, and guardians who arrive as newcomers? These newcomers can carry the written message of hope home to the teens. So simple but so effective.

I did attend Assembly last fall to see and hear for myself how Ontario South supports Alateen. I really appreciate all the HARD work by Leslie and Joan, and countless other Alateen committee members to complete the Alateen Charter. Alateen will now have its own finances to work with, and the ability to accept contributions to the Ontario South Advisory Committee (OSAAC) from groups and districts. Ontario South Assembly voted to return Alateen their funds, which is showing great support to Alateen. These funds, like those of Al-Anon are used for seed money to the district holding the Alateen Unity Conference, expenses for Alateen to attend service workshops, and perhaps rekindling "The Alateen Road Show". Alateen are GREAT fundraisers too. They are very talented and committed in carrying their message of Hope to other teens.

I would like to stimulate conversation with Alateen group sponsors, SAMS, to be available to participate in Alateen workshops in districts and perhaps Al-Anon Day events. My contact information can be found on the back of Open Lines.

important that they know they have someone to talk things out with/share with regarding group matters. The OSACC email is for the use of Alateens ONLY and all others would direct their communications to me.

We've just arranged on Sunday morning a special "Country Breakfast" meeting (for \$26), hearing the experience, strength and hopes of past Trillium chairpersons, followed by a spiritual speaker to close the conference. Not to mention all the DoubleTree Hotel by Hilton has to offer guests (from restaurants & boutiques to a waterslide pool and spa area). This event is basically PACKED!!

The committee is coming out with various commemorative items to help honour Trillium's 20 years - the first being a colourful sheet of Al-Anon slogan fridge magnets (\$3 each or 2 for \$5). We also plan on presenting Trillium 2012 pens and T-shirts for purchase in the approaching months.
